Message from the Chairman of the Board

2014 was another strong year of growth for the Community Foundation of Orillia and Area. With our administration contract with the CDC working well, we were able to continue to focus strongly on our core activities of building, managing and granting our charitable endowment funds.

In the area of building our endowment funds, we worked with our existing fundholders, strong local charities and philanthropic donors to grow our funds by over \$600,000. This growth was driven largely by growth in the W. Scott & Jean Tudhope Fund and the establishment of new funds by the Mariposa Folk Foundation and the Orillia Museum of Art & History. Our goal is to grow our portfolio to over \$5 million by 2017 and we are actively working with local charities, professional advisors and donors to reach this goal.

In the management of our existing endowment funds, we ended the year with a total investment portfolio value of over \$3.0 million. We continue to have a strong working relationship with our primary investment managers Connor, Clark & Lunn and our core endowment fund portfolio generated a net return of nearly 10% in 2014. Our alternate investment manager agreement with Karen O'Coin at BMO Nesbitt Burns to manage the new Tudhope Fund had a successful second year and we look forward to continuing this relationship going forward.

On the granting front, we awarded nearly \$115,000 worth of grants to local charities including the The Sharing Place Food Bank, Autism Ontario, Camp Couchiching, The Lighthouse, Jubilee House, Telecare Distress Line, Colwater Heritage Museum and others. These grants helped these charities to deliver the critical services they provide to our community. In addition to granting from our endowment funds, we were fortunate in 2014 to receive donations from the Orillia Vocal Ensemble, and both our Investment Managers that we flowed-through directly into additional grants to local charities totaling over \$7,500.

It is critical to remember that the CFOA is not a front-line charity delivering service to the community. We are an enabler. We connect donors with a desire to give back to our community with charities in our community that are doing critical work and need financial support. Finally, a big thank you to all of the members of the Community Foundation Board of Directors and other community members who have given their time and effort to make all of this good work possible.






